Rosepath Auction:

Live Auction:

45" Leclerc Mira Loom:

This year, we have more equipment and supplies donated to us for our fundraising activities.

Our biggest item is a **45" Nilus Leclerc loom**, with 4 shafts, from a guild member who we lost last June from cancer. It is in good working condition and comes with reeds, a regular shuttle and a rag shuttle. It has been handed down from grandmother to daughter to grandson's wife, so it has been cared for in one family.

Also there is a **45" Leclerc Fanny Loom** and a smaller **Fold-up Loom**.

Antique Skein Winder:

This lovely upright skein winder is just under 3 feet tall, is quite old and in very good condition.

Skein Swift: Solid good wooden swift. Portable and collapsible.

A traditional spinning wheel – possibly an Ashford.

Indian Head Spinner

Warping boards, tapestry frames, smaller weaving and spinning equipment and some beautiful baskets. There are also some weaving and colour design books.

Yarns:

We also have numerous **wool yarns** for weaving and knitting; full cones of **cotton yarns** of various colours and thicknesses; **festive novelty yarns** with sparkle, slubs and inclusions, in time for holidays; and yarns of mixed fibre contents.

Workshops

The 2019 workshop schedule has been out since November 3rd and registrations are coming in at a good rate. There are several ways to access the new schedule:

- 1. Jan made a printed flyer with titles and dates sorted by category. These are available in the Studio and a copy is posted outside the Studio.
- 2. Jan produced a beautiful printed catalogue. One copy lives in the Studio, the other in the demo bin. You can peruse it at your leisure any time the Studio is accessible.
- 3. Full descriptions of each workshop are posted on our website. They are sorted by category and listed in date order. http://www.ovwsg.com/workshops/ Some workshops are posted in more than one category (e.g. Colour Theory 1, Dye the Colour Wheel, A Textile Sample Book) if they could appeal to more than one discipline.

4. You can also access workshop listings through the Calendar on the website. To look at January 2019 go to http://www.ovwsg.com/new-calendar/ and use the arrows to get to January. On a computer, hovering over a title will bring up the description and location; clicking on a title in the calendar will take you to the listing. On a tablet or phone tapping the title will show you the description but may not take you to the full listing - instead go to the workshop category page and find the full description there.

Each listing gives you full information on the workshop. It also tells you how many spaces are left. A workshop needs 4 students to allow it to run, so if the Class size minus the number of spaces left equals 4 or more it's good to go. As workshops become full the registration widget is replaced with a link to the waitlist form. I track these as they come in, if there is enough interest and I can arrange for the instructor and a suitable space I will try to create a by request session of popular workshops so filling in that form is valuable. It also means that if you find you have to cancel for any reason it is important to let me know as soon as possible as I might have someone else who wants your spot.

If you are on Facebook please share the events that Kelly creates to advertise our workshops. This has been very successful in filling our workshops. Many of our January workshops already have enough students to allow them to run, but all have spots. These titles are running in January:

Library

Tis the time of last-minute Christmas projects so come check out the library for inspiration. Or some unsubtle hints to the family of what you might like. If you leave a book about spinning wheels on your pillow and occasionally in other prominent spots around the house even the most unobservant may get the hint! Deep sighs while reading said book may also help!

The library should be open for your perusal by 9am the Monday of the meeting (please check Facebook; I will post as soon as I have arrived). Don't forget to bring back your library items. If you can't make the meeting contact the librarians and see if you can extend your loans to the next meeting (if they are not requested it should be fine). The library will close at 7:15pm please bring your books in as early as you can so that we can have enough time to pack up and attend the meeting too! December meetings are not to be missed!!!

We have graciously been given a copy of Weaving Baterman Blend, My Own Journey by the author, Margaret Franklin. She was selling her book at the co-op booth. If you didn't get to see it you can check out the library copy and then you might want to order one of your own from Margaret. If you are interested in

multi-harness weaving you will want to check this out.

The Library request list produced a request that is already on the acquisition list (so it's good to know we are looking for the right things!) and a technology request. We have been focusing on the Digital DVD's to allow us to get you more options for a better price. We do have some DVD's that will play in recent DVD players, even some of the digital ones will play in players with the upgraded codex packs. The manufacturer suggests that digital DVDs play best with the VLC player which is a free downloadable program and on computer. Unfortunately many laptops no longer come with an internal DVD player so an external DVD player is required. They have dropped to under \$50.00 and can be acquired from computer stores like best Buy or Canada Computer. Check Black Friday or Boxing Day sales for the best prices. The librarians have considered getting an external DVD player but if you don't have a UPS port this may not be the right option. We can set you up to view the DVDs on the guild laptop with headphones. You could watch them at a social, the Monday of the meeting during the day, Tuesdays that the Tuesday weavers are there or contact the librarians so we can arrange another day. With changing technology we are investigating other possible loan options and will keep you informed if we find something that seems viable.

Please join us at la Cabane en Bois Rond,331 Cite des Jeunes in Gatineau, Quebec (Hull sector) for a day of spinning or any other fibre-filled activity. The Cabane is a massive log construction that backs onto the Gatineau Park. Our room has views of the park from nearly all the windows.

The date is Saturday, January 19, 2019 from 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

The entry fee is only \$5 per person and there will be door prizes and local vendors. We have twenty vendor spaces available on a first come first served basis at \$20.00 per table. If you can't make it as vendor we encourage you to provide business cards for the admissions desk, or donate a door prize.

Coffee is available on site. You can bring a lunch, order in, or take advantage of nearby restaurants. We ask that you respect the beauty of this facility and keep it tidy. The Cabane backs onto the Gatineau park and some members might like to take a walk, ski, or snowshoe for a while along the paths.

There is easy access for people with mobility challenges and for vendor unloading and loading.

Parking is free and there is loads of it.


