In Memoriam

Natalie Shumovsky



It is with great sorrow that we inform you that our Natalie Shumovsky passed away, February 28, 2021. Having been diagnosed with terminal pancreatic cancer just before Christmas, she faced her rapidly progressing illness with great courage and resolve.

Natalie joined the Guild as a novice weaver in 2013, having taken to the craft like a fish to water. In no time at all she became one of the Guild's sought-after vendors at the Exhibition and Sale, selling her fine shawls, table linens and beautifully dyed yarns to loyal customers who looked for her year after year. As well as that, she freely gave of her time to produce the Guild's monthly newsletter for the past seven years, served for two years as Co-President and since May 2020, was Chair of the Board of Directors.

As well, Natalie was a regular participant in the Guild's Tuesday Open Studio Days, sharing her enthusiasm for looms, information about resources for reasonably priced yarns and her tales of scuba diving in the St. Lawrence or Caribbean and working in the Armed Forces.

Natalie's untimely passing will leave a big void in the weaving community and in our lives. She will be greatly missed.

Workshops

Wire Armature Study Group Update:

We had 4 meetings looking at various gauges of wire that we had been able to assemble. We sampled bare wire, as well we made small appendages as samples covered in wool (mostly legs with feet). We are still working on finishing samples and working on an annotated bibliography of books and web reference. We will have one last meeting to sum-up our findings and exchange information.

This was a lot of fun and I hope others will be able to try the online study groups as the guild start the next offerings shortly.

Workshops and Study Groups

We have made a good start with the initial 3 study groups and are now ready to expand our offerings. Now we need more ideas and leaders! Please share your ideas and your willingness to lead a group with me at workshops@wattfamily.ca. Leaders should have a good grasp of the topic to be studied but need not be experts.

Our next planned study group will be 2103 Wet Felted Fibre Study Group led by Ann McElroy. This group will study the felt-ability and usability of different breeds of wool in felting. It will explore the ease with which different breeds can be made into felt and what uses they may have. Variables such as layout, density, and felting methods will be explored. Other animal fibres may be assessed and possibly the mixing of wool and other non-felting fibres such as silk, cotton, and nylon. The group will run on Zoom every other Wednesday starting 21 April 2021 for a total of 5 sessions. For further information see:
