President's Message

Fall is a time of transitions— back to school, back to warm clothes, and back to heartier, comforting foods. I'm thinking ahead to Christmas with my weaving projects, although I'll admit that my output never quite matches my intentions!

By the time you read this, the guild will be transitioning in small steps. Natalie's sale will be over and our first workshops in 19 months will be ready to begin. We will be clearing out the extra equipment that has accumulated in the Studio so that we can once again be able to gather in small groups to weave, spin, and visit the library. We will carefully review feedback over the next few months and err on the side of caution. We want to protect our members, our guests, and our Heartwood House colleagues.

We are planning to gradually reopen over the next few months. To this end, the board passed a new policy on COVID-19. In line with public health guidelines and municipal and provincial regulations, it specifies that OVWSG members and visitors must show proof of vaccination and wear a mask while inside to participate in our informal and formal gatherings. Policy	
	The OVWSG is a service organization and as such has the moral and legal responsibility to protect the safety of anyone on its premises. Access to OVWSG premises, as to all other membership benefits, is a privilege that comes with conditions and responsibilities.
	In 2020, the world experienced an outbreak of the highly contagious and dangerous COVID-19 virus that soon was declared a pandemic. The purpose of this policy is for the OVWSG to do its utmost to protect members and guests from being infected with the virus while on OVWSG premises. Given the unpredictability of the pandemic this policy will be revised as needed to reflect changing circumstances and Government regulations.

Procedures	
Entering Heartwood House	Before gaining access to Heartwood House, OVWSG members and visitors must answer the COVID-19 questionnaire and commit to abide by Heartwood House Covid-19 protocols as required, including the wearing of face masks in all common areas.
Entering and staying on OVWSG premises	OVWSG members and visitors attending meetings, workshops, and classes, renting equipment, borrowing publications, working on OVWSG equipment and participating in informal gatherings must:
	 use hand sanitizer upon entering show proof of vaccination wear a mask while inside provide contact information maintain a two-metre distance from others if possible Individuals who are exempt from the vaccination obligation for medical reasons must:
	 provide a medical exemption certificate signed by physician and provide a negative COVID-19 test that has been issued in the past three days.
Other Precautions	Members and visitors must avoid sharing equipment, materials, and other common items while in the Studio and Classroom.
Leaving OVWSG premises	Members and visitors must wipe down all surfaces and equipment used and make sure that the premises are in the same condition as before entering.

Gist Yarn opened in 2017 to provide quality weaving yarns and fresh pattern ideas to weavers. They have grown into a team of five women who contribute to a thriving textile industry by working with fibre farmers, spinning mills, dye houses, weaving instructors, pattern designers, and brick and mortar yarn shops. Patterns for both rigid heddle and multi-shaft looms are featured. They also host a weekly podcast - Weave podcast - where those who make up all aspects of the weaving community come together and share stories and the threads that bind us together.

At our November meeting, we will be hosting Diane Taraz from Boston, Massachusetts, who will present "Top to Toe, the Natural History of Clothing". This is a fabulous production of song and storytelling about spinning, weaving, and sewing and how clothing has both responded to social issues and driven cultural movements throughout history.

For December, if we are still Zooming, we're planning to have a BINGO and equipment auction as we did for last year's meeting. Or if we're lucky enough to meet in person by then, we'll have our Rosepath and equipment auctions.

As for 2022, there are plans in the works, but we're waiting to see how COVID protocols evolve this fall before confirming details. Here's hoping we can soon meet in person once again.

Selecting Books:

Members in good standing may request 4 library items for the circulating part of the library. I find browsing the topics/subject list the most helpful when I am looking for something. However, we also have lists by Title, Author, More than 4 harness looms and of course a full list of all the issues of the different magazines we have in the Magazine list (just the title will occur in the subject list so check the magazine list for all the issues). Requesting Books:

After browsing the numerous lists of the library collection please organize your request:

Call number, Title, then Author.

This will make it quicker for us to pull all the books for members. (This new distanced way of running the library is a lot more work for the Librarians and this one little thing make it a lot easier on us)

Email your Requested to library@ovwsg.com (this will go to both Jan and Ann).

We will email you back and let you know you have been added to the list of books to pull for this library day. If we have had multiple requests for the same book, or your request is due back the same day you want it, or it is missing from the shelf without permission (we do search to see if it was miss-shelved). We will let you know and may be able to offer an alternative until we can get you your requested items.


Remember to let us know if you need to have an alternate pickup option (see below *Optional pickup locations*) or if you need someone else to pick up your books with theirs.

If Multiple members requesting the same book:

Since we have been seeing quite a bit of popularity for the same books, we have started a waiting list for some items. Because of this, it has been useful to have an alternate 5th option when you list your requests in case you have selected one of these very requested titles. We can also sometimes suggest an alternative if one of your books has not yet been returned or has been selected by someone else already (we will add you to the waiting list to get it on another library day).

The Reference section:

Remember REF books are non-circulating and stay in the studio. Before covid they could be viewed in the studio; by appointment or at socials (when space allowed) and before the Monday meetings. Once we have permission from Hartwood house we will set up appointments to come in and use the reference section. We will keep you updated as we get more info. Hartwood house has been more cautious than the provincial guidelines so it may take a bit longer to get to see the reference books. (I am sure they are very lonely and would like to be viewed!)



- 1. Bring a sheet of paper with your NAME printed clearly in BIG letters.
- 2. Go to 404 McArthur Ave. It is across from the Dairy Queen. There is parking on McArthur Ave, in the little plaza at the east end of the building and behind the building.
- 3. Tap on the studio window. (It is the first set of windows after the foyer by the Unitarian door, at the west end of the building.) Hold up your sign so we can read it and match your name to your bag of books.
- 4. Once we have your books in hand, we will meet you at the Unitarian Door just west of the studio window.

Optional pickup locations after September 6th please indicate when you request your books if you need one of the other locations.

- Before November 7 Let the Librarians know at <u>library@ovwsg.com</u> that you want to pick up your books at Heartwood House's front desk. We will email back when your books are ready for pick up. Then you can Email <u>schedule@ovwsg.com</u> to arrange a Pickup day at the Heartwood House front desk. (When you arrive, tell the front desk workers your name and that you have Guild library books to pick up)

Heartwood House news

Heartwood House remains in a geographic hotspot. As a result, the front door is to remain locked at this time.

Please remember to continue to follow these COVID-19 safety measures:

- Email Elizabeth Watt <u>schedule@ovwsg.com</u> before attending the studio or classroom at Heartwood House. Elizabeth will administer the COVID health questionnaire and supply HH with the list of visitors.


