# Message from the OVWSG Web master

Some of our members have not been receiving emails from the guild, such as invitations to Zoom meetings and monthly emails with a link to the newsletter. We are working hard to try and resolve this problem.

If you have not been getting our emails here are some things you can do.

- Check with our membership person that your email is correct on our list. You can email her at membership@ovwsg.com.
- Check your spam/junk folder in your email program to see if any of our emails are there. If you find one, take the time to move it to your inbox or mark it as not junk which will help future emails be sent to your inbox.
- o If you don't find the emails in your junk folder please let us know you are not receiving them. You can contact me at website@ovwsg.com.

Here is why our emails are disappearing and what we are doing about it.

- When emails disappear, they are most likely being marked as spam somewhere along the route they take to get to you. Emails sent to long lists of people look suspicious to spam filters.
- We have signed up for MailerLite, a service that sends emails to a mailing list for us. Each email is sent individually. Unfortunately, not everyone is receiving these emails either. You will see the MailerLite logo at the bottom of these emails.
- Sometimes we send out emails two different ways so please be tolerant if you get two emails with the same content. We are trying to make sure that as many people as possible get our messages.

You can email and request us to pull books for you as we were doing during COVID shutdowns. Members in good standing (not having overdue items) can take out 4 library items (except Ref.) Items taken out at the April meeting will be due back before the next meeting, May 1<sup>st,</sup> 2023. Let the Liberians know if you are taking the OHS Master Spinners or Master Weavers courses, you can take out more books to help with your homework.

The library fine for **overdue items is 1.50 per month per item**. Last month, there were quite a few people who did not return their books. Please drop them into the book return box in the studio, the front desk of Heartwood House during business hours or in the west end near the Iris street transit stop then let us know you have dropped them off. Library fines go towards new books.

We have been able to fill in some of our missing Weavers, Weavers Journals and Handwoven this month from some of the very generous donations we have received. The Librarians would like to say thank you on behalf of the guild.

## **Equipment Rentals**

Greeting Guild Members,

I have been working as the Spinning Rental Coordinator for more than 6 years, and it's time to step down. I'm looking for another member who is willing to take on this role.

- Rental Coordinator is a low-key opportunity to volunteer.
- Experience with equipment is not required (I had less than a year spinning when I took on the role).
- It is an opportunity to familiarize yourself with a variety of wheels and fibre prep equipment.
- The time commitment is lower than with some other volunteer positions.
- You don't have to attend board meetings.
- It is an important way for us to raise funds to keep the guild running. Most fees are collected via Paypal invoice, so no money to handle.

I have been doing this from home over the pandemic, which is very convenient.

To be a coordinator you need:

- 1. An email address to receive forwarded requests for rentals and send replies. Your Gmail will work iust fine.
- 2. A way to keep track of rentals (I use the electronic spreadsheet that I inherited from the last coordinator; it works great).
- 3. A folder to keep hard copies of the rental agreements, with the attached deposit cheque from the renter.
- 4. An electronic copy of the members list to verify the renter is a member (it is emailed monthly, easy to find in my mailbox).
- 5. A calendar to figure out what Monday is meeting night (our rental return date) and remind folks when to return/renew rentals.
- 6. Optionally, a small space at home to keep a few rental items on hand (or you can meet renters at the guild). I keep a selection of items at home in a closet.

# Heartwood House Parking

## **Parking**

## 1. Back parking lot:

- The parking area at the Moorvale entrance by the back door entrance and the parking area from the storage pods to the west fence are reserved for permit holders only from Monday to Friday from 8:00a.m. to 4:00p.m.
- Vehicles with no permits on the dashboard will be ticketed.
- There are no parking restrictions in the back lot after 4:00p.m. from Monday to Friday and on Saturday.

## 2. Front lot:

- Visitors parked in the front lot must be registered on the front desk journal.
- A fee of \$1 is charged for parking in the front lot. Please pay at the Heartwood House front desk.
- Vehicles not registered in the visitor parking journal will be ticketed.
- Visitors who are popping in to drop off an item to a member are not required to pay a fee or register the vehicle.
