#### Our Extra Handwoven and Spin Off for sale.




We have new books and a CD this month! We are extremely grateful for these donations, and you may recognize the names of these authors. We have amazing people in our guild!



## Workshops

The Dianne Totten Crimp and Create Workshop still has spaces available. You do need to warp a loom ahead, but the warping is quite straightforward. We can arrange a table loom for you, free of charge, but you would need to arrange with me or the weaving rental coordinator for pickup. You also need a polyester based yarn, but Dianne says that polyester sewing thread (currently on 50% off sale at Fabricland!) will do fine for weft crimp and anything that will sett at about 20epi plain weave goes for warp. If you have Orlec in your stash now is the time to let it shine (sadly, I gave away or buried the cones of Orlec I'm sure I had, so I have spent the past week's evenings plying serger thread for warp. Yes, yes I am certifiable, but I'm mostly harmless.)

#### Parking

#### 1. Back parking lot:
