Hi everyone!

Since the June meeting is our AGM, we won't be having a guest speaker. We do hope that you've enjoyed hearing from all the amazing guests we've hosted since last September. We do have some fibre challenges to help fill your summer with creative fun! Here are the options proposed and how to participate:

Choice #1: Mystery Fibre Package challenge and fundraiser - a wonderful idea from Carl!

For \$10, you get a package of assorted yarns. You don't choose which one you get, hence the "Mystery!" You create (weave, spin, felt) something using the yarn from the package. You may include other fibres from your own stash.

The fibre packages were generously donated by Mandy and will be available for purchase in person at the June meeting.

Choice #2: Fibre Poker (as in previous years.)

For those who are remote, or prefer a different challenge, we'll run the Fibre Poker, as we have in past years. In Fibre Poker, you get four cards in a category of your choice: spinning, weaving, or felting. You may trade one card from your initial hand. These four cards form your "roadmap" to the elements (e.g. fibre, colour, technique, etc.) you'll need to incorporate into making your item.

Everyone will have an opportunity to showcase their "challenge creations" during the extended Show & Tell at our September meeting! We look forward to seeing you at the June meeting and we hope that you'll participate in one of the Fibre Challenges.

I plan to start working on the Fall schedule in early July, with the hope of having it live by mid-August. I am debating plotting all the way to June 2024, but will at least have the offerings to December finalized for August. As always, if you are interested in teaching with the guild please get in touch.

I know some people have expressed interest in summer workshops and I may have some instructors available. The challenge of summer has always been having enough students available on the same days as the instructor. When I have tried to schedule ahead during the summer invariably I have picked the date when those most interested are away on vacation! If you are interested in having a particular workshop this summer I will need your help, as the best way to do it is via the "By Request" system. Here are the steps:

1. Email me with the topic you are interested in and your availability between July 1 and Aug 31. Be specific but give me as much flexibility as you can (e.g., any Saturday except the first weekend in August, only Sunday July 16, 23 and 30, Mondays and Wednesdays in August after 11:00am)

2. I will see if I have an instructor available within those dates. If I do I will create a description page on the website that you can use to help you find enough students to run the workshop. Once you have at least 4 students who will commit to registering I will set up the registration part of the page. Your group will need to register quickly to confirm that the workshop will run. If there are spaces left once your group has registered I will open registration to whoever wants to join in.

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

Parking
