Library

You can email and request us to pull books for you. Members in good standing (not having overdue items) can take out 4 library items (except Ref.) Let the Liberians know if you are taking the OHS Master Spinners or Master Weavers courses, you can take out more books to help with your homework.

The library fine for **overdue items is 1.50 per month per item**. Last month, there were quite a few people who did not return their books. Please drop them into the book return box in the studio, the front desk of Heartwood House during business hours or in the west end near the Iris street transit stop then let us know you have dropped them off. Library fines go towards new books.

Programs

September's program will be our traditional extended show & tell along with the summer challenge results. There was a shift in this year's challenge from the usual assigned poker cards. Instead in June, participants purchased a zip bag of assorted yarns with which to make something. Come share what you've been creating this summer.

In October, Miriam Tepper will speak about the history, origins, and development of nalbinding. I enjoyed her workshop this summer and learned that there's much more to it than I thought. Worked with a single needle, I found the process to be more like weaving and hand sewing rather than knitting.

We had programs scheduled until next year, but life happens, and we've had some cancellations. So, I'm still busy working to schedule this guild year. While meetings will continue to be hybrid (both in-person and via Zoom) I'm looking to have more local speakers while still hosting out of town Zoom presenters for the winter months of January, February, and March.

Workshops

The September to December 2023 OVWSG Workshop Schedule is now live. Please see the attached PDF, beautifully created by Jan Scott (not just a pretty librarian, our Jan!), for the list of titles and links to the registration pages. After some kerfuffle, caused by my ineptitude with html and fixed by webmistress extraordinaire, Judy Kavanaugh (who cannot complain that I repeat mistakes, I am getting more creative with new ones every year!), we think everything is live and working. Please email me at workshops@wattfamily.ca if you find anything out of order that we missed.

Members have exclusive access until August 31, when non-member tickets will be added. We have looked ahead to the winter and will have the schedule for January to April ready in time for the Ex and Sale.

We are also working on scheduling "One Hour Wonder" workshops, generally on Monday evenings. These will be a mix of hands-on, demonstration or lecture format depending on the topic. Some of the topics we have thought of:

Pine Needle Basketry - make a button Demonstration of winding a warp with a warping mill and paddle Wet Felted Beads Discussion of the use of different needles for needle felting Introduction to a weave structure with samples

(we actually came up with about 2 dozen topics very quickly, but this ought to give an idea of where we are going)

Cost would be \$17 members/\$20 non-members (plus tax), hands on ones might have a very nominal material fee. Some of these might be suitable for a hybrid in-person/virtual presentation.

I'm hoping to be ready to offer a few of these as a pilot in October.

Entry Rules & Guidelines

Submitted pieces must not be more than 2 years old.

You may submit up to three entries, one per category: Weaving, spinning, felting or basketry.

Depending on number of submissions and space available we may not be able to include multiple submissions in the exhibition. If you are submitting more than one entry, please indicate your preferred order of priority to display.

All submissions must arrive ready for display. All submissions must include clear instructions on how the piece is to be displayed. If special hardware or display element is required (i.e., mannequin, display cube), it must be included with the submission.

Each submission must be delivered to the guild studio no later than **Monday, October 10**. Please be sure to drop them off in the labelled bin with a printed copy of your entry form attached to the submission.

An electronic copy of submission forms must be sent by email to <u>cs388@hotmail.com</u> with **Ex and Sale Submission** in the subject line no later than **Monday, October 10**.

Submissions are to be picked up during takedown at the end of the Ex and Sale on **Sunday, November 04 at 4:00pm.** If not picked up then, items will be returned to the guild.

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

Parking

1. Back parking lot:
