President's Message

Happy Autumn Guild members!

Although the date suggests the end of summer, we are still having some pretty nice weather, lucky us!

With the onset of the cooler weather, we are coming up on some exciting events in our calendar. The first one being the move of the 100" loom to its new home on the second floor, kitty corner to the elevator, due to be set up and ready for the next project in October; the annual Sale and Exhibition is being held on November 4 and 5 at the Glebe Community Centre and we will be hosting some exciting presenters at our monthly meetings.

We are working with the Multifaith Housing Initiative, who incidentally are taking over the old classroom space, to reach out to the broader community and bring weaving, spinning, and felting to them. There are many groups that do not have the opportunity to see what we do, and we want to engage them and learn from them as well. This project is in its infancy, and I will be reaching out for volunteers in the near future.

Unfortunately, Heartwood House was broken into recently and a set of keys to the outside doors was stolen. The locks have been rekeyed and new keys issued. We are using this as an opportunity to rethink the issuance of the few keys we have and hopefully this will work for those needing access to the Guild resources outside of HH business hours. Also, it was seen on the CC cameras that the suspects tried every door in the building to try to gain access and were fortunately unsuccessful. I have been made aware that some Guild members have come to the studio door and found it unlocked – please ensure that you lock it when you leave. Better lighting and other security features are being installed by HH to decrease the chance of this happening again.

Plans for the 75th anniversary are roaring ahead with the recent call out for the tapestry project. We have had a great response and will keep members informed of our progress!

Updates from Program Coordinators

Library

drop off options. Overdue books are 1.50 per items per month. Please take good care of the books, DVD's, Thumb drives and magazines you borrow, we want them to be in good shape so many other members can enjoy them!

We have a number of new donations that have been added to the library. There will be more additions before the meeting so I will send out a full list of the new items when I have finished going through all of the boxes. (We will send out through the membership list as well as mailer light in hopes that all the guild members will get the list.)

BIG project (Important)**

Another big project that has been taking up a lot of library time. (Those of you on Facebook will have likely have notice I am in a lot this month and over the summer, more than just long hours on Mondays!) During covid we received a number of large donations (and some very generous small ones). When they arrived, I had pulled books we could add to the collection and had put the others aside while I was working on other projects (yes, the library has a lot of projects).

So what's happening;

1. I wrote a donations database

2. I am checking each book against the collection (in case it is one of the missing ones from the book count – in progress, just Reference section left.)

3. I am adding each donated book to the new database with some of its data

4. Lastly, I am checking the online pricing without shipping (not just amazon who can be nuts on their prices) adding a price and id number to a sticky which I put in the book. Books are grouped by price.

5. Using the data base will allow us to keep track of the 3 sections of the sale as well as letting us sort the list by title, author, and price. (or if you wanted, we could sort by year of publication if known, comments about the book or condition, or price range found on-line)

Pre-covid we went through a large group of donated books and magazines which are extra to us. They were going to be put online for sale. They have returned so I will also add them to this project (so you will likely see more of me at the studio.)

**the important part for you is that the priced books and the incredibly low priced 2.00 magazine, will be available for Members purchase at the October meeting. Any left after the members are done will be available at the sale and exhibition in November to the general public, then be put up for sale online.

We would like to welcome New Librarians Leonard and Ann (yes, we now have 2 Ann's). You may have also seen Cathy Louise and Robyn helping put away books and keeping the library neat! Studio Looms

As most of you know, the OVWSG has a wonderful collection of looms in the studio. There are 4,8, and 12 shaft looms, single and double warp beams, direct tie-up, jack, counterbalance and countermarche. They range in weaving size from 26" to 45". They include Nilus, Clement, Nilart, Babywolf, Fanny, Louet...... A few of them are robust enough to handle the heaviest rug or blanket that you would want to weave, and many of them have a delicate enough touch to do fine threads and lace weaves.

One of the beauties of weaving in the studio is that you are often not alone, and many of the people there are incredibly generous with their knowledge and time, answering questions and guiding weavers as they explore their craft and the tools. Personally, In spite of having two looms at home, I have woven on three of them, each one very different from the next, and each project (one of which was a community project) very satisfying with lovely, finished pieces. And I DID get lots of help with each one!

Arranging to rent a loom is super-easy! Email <u>rentals@ovwsg.com</u> to contact the loom rental coordinator. The fee is only \$10 per month, and you are automatically eligible for a 3-month rental, renewable as long as there is no request for the same loom while you are on it. In the unlikely event - has not happened yet - that there is a request for "your" loom, you will be given generous time to finish your project while every attempt will be made to find an alternate, but suitable loom for the second individual.

And for those of you who are holding back because of access to the room, no worries there: the room has a lock box with a key to the door in it. You will be given the box code to access the key if you are working on a studio loom. So, you will have access five days a week - as long as Heartwood House is open you can get in and leave whenever you want.

So, for the project that your loom at home will not do, sign up to weave in the studio! I look forward to getting swamped with requests!

You may submit up to three entries, one per category: Weaving, spinning, felting or basketry.

Depending on number of submissions and space available we may not be able to include multiple submissions in the exhibition. If you are submitting more than one entry, please indicate your preferred order of priority to display.

All submissions must arrive ready for display. All submissions must include clear instructions on how the piece is to be displayed. If special hardware or display element is required (i.e., mannequin, display cube), it must be included with the submission.

Each submission must be delivered to the guild studio no later than **Monday, October 10**. Please be sure to drop them off in the labelled bin with a printed copy of your entry form attached to the submission.


Carl will also be presenting the exhibition *clò mòr* at the Mississippi Valley Textile Museum in Almonte.

Parking

1. Back parking lot:
