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President's Message

Happy New Year!

I hope everyone had a nice break from their normal routine and were able to spend some quality time with family. We are now in the full thrall of winter with all the fun and not so much fun!

As most of you will have already heard, Heartwood House was broken into a third time over the weekend of January 12-14. The thieves used a crowbar to open an outside door and office doors. They broke into the 100" loom room and apart from rummaging around for valuables (to them), nothing was stolen or vandalized. I made a police report and impact statement as per HH's request and submitted that within a couple of days.

Other organizations were not so lucky. Their offices were torn apart and laptops, credit cards and other valuables were stolen. This is a very serious blow to these charities as budgets are very thin and these items will be difficult to replace. Yes, they have insurance, but the time and energy needed to get back to normal will take a great toll.

There was a locksmith on site all week after the break-in and all doors have been fitted with deadbolts. We now have all our doors (except the storage closets) secured and the classroom key will fit all the doors. The studio key will be taken out of circulation. When you are leaving the Guild rooms, please ensure that you lock both the deadbolt and handle locks. Access to the Heartwood House building on a day outside office hours is sometimes a tricky thing. If there is a workshop in the Studio, you are not able to use that room, if the workshop is in the classroom, you can use the Studio. Sending an email to the teacher of the workshop can alert them

For Awareness

Beware of Phishing Schemes

A phishing scheme recently targeted some of our guild members.

In late December, some of our members received an email, purportedly from me, that said, "I require a little of your time in getting something important done for me. Let me know if you are free. Thanks"

Those who replied were sent a second message asking for help to buy gift cards as a thanks to "our diligent guild board members" and were told that there would be a gift card for the donor too.

The OVWSG never solicits money for gift cards or donations like this at all. It was a scam. The clever part was that they used two email addresses that sounded like they could belong to a weaver (sweetweaver360@gmail.com and lovetoweave360@gmail.com). I have never had those email addresses. They were aliases for the scammer.

Police warn that red flags for these kind of phishing schemes include several that were used here:

- Secrecy: Using words such as "This should be confidential" or "Please keep this quiet for now"
- Asking for gift cards or Bitcoin
- **Urgency**: Something is required today or right away

Please be cautious with email and if anything feels fishy, do what several members did, which was to reach out to me using the official Guild email (chair@ovwsg.com) or my personal email address.

Socials Update



Barbara Hale

21 July 1947 – 28 April 2023

Barbara Ruth Hale passed away peacefully on April 28, 2023, in Ottawa. She was in palliative care at Élisabeth Bruyère Hospital after suffering a stroke in February. She was 75.

While in Montreal, Barbara and her friend Sandy Thomas opened a shop called Le Tisserin (The Weaver) in Monkland Village, where they sold yarns, looms, and weaving supplies.


In 1992, Barbara moved to Ottawa. After considering a career in museum conservation of fabrics, Barbara began working has an art therapist with dementia patients who were living in long term care.


Later Barbara became particularly attracted to Aboriginal art, especially Inuit sculpture, and over three decades she amassed a significant collection which she displayed throughout her home. She followed particular Canadian Indigenous and Inuit artists and read extensively about the work, about the artists that she admired, and about the history of the Aboriginal peoples. She worked for a while at the Inuit Art Gallery in Ottawa, until it closed in 2012.

Heartwood House Parking

Parking

1. Back parking lot:
