### Studio Loom Use - IMPORTANT NOTICE

Please note that any loom that is in use at the Guild overnight or longer, MUST have a label indicating who is weaving on it, what they are weaving, and - if they are with a class - who the instructor is as well as the name of the class/workshop. It is the users' responsibility to ensure that their work is traceable.

There are labels available in an envelope on the wall of the classroom, and just a piece of paper attached to the loom is adequate, provided it has the required information.

Any unidentified project on a loom may result in that loom being vacated and put back into circulation.

## **Annual General Meeting**

June and with it our AGM, during which we will elect or confirm members to fill vacant Guild positions, is fast approaching.

Without our dedicated group of volunteers, the Guild would not be able to continue to provide all of the services to the fibre arts community that it currently does. Volunteers are responsible for many of key roles and provide a great service to our members. 

## OVWSG 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary E-book; meet our members & their work

An overview of the guild in its 75<sup>th</sup> year with a history of the guild, who we are and what we have done. This is for our members not the general public.

#### Part 1 History

But it would be nice to have someone else coordinating this section's information.) this section looks at where we came from and how we got here.

guild participation: inspired other family members to weave or felt for her. Assisted librarian with spell checking (more enthusiasm than actual spell checking, which consisted of body slamming the keyboard to provide all missing letters all at once.)

Fiber bio: She grew, harvested (shed), blended and felted her own fiber. she was making a felt installation piece on her Dining room chair. Unfortunately, her self felted instillation artwork was destroyed by a passing vacuum cleaner.

Favorite memory of the guild: Mom made me the best biggest fish cat cave at a guild workshop. It was the biggest cat cave in the class and perfectly suitable for the center of the universe. I also have found the library paper work was particularly comfortable as I have kept it warm and unable to escape by sitting on it.

Wet felted over a resist, fins felted and added afterwords. Wool is roving from a Finn sheep.



### Heartwood House Parking

#### **Parking**

#### 1. Back parking lot:

- The parking area at the Moorvale entrance by the back door entrance and the parking area from the storage pods to the west fence are reserved for permit holders only from Monday to Friday from 8:00a.m. to 4:00p.m.
- Vehicles with no permits on the dashboard will be ticketed.
- There are no parking restrictions in the back lot after 4:00p.m. from Monday to Friday and on Saturday.

#### 2. Front lot:

- Visitors parked in the front lot must be registered on the front desk journal.
- A fee of \$1 is charged for parking in the front lot. Please pay at the Heartwood House front desk.
- Vehicles not registered in the visitor parking journal will be ticketed.
- Visitors who are popping in to drop off an item to a member are not required to pay a fee or register the vehicle.
